RE: Application for a Permanent Resident Card

Dear client;

This office has initiated a Permanent Resident Determination investigation as a result of your application for a Permanent Resident Card. The purpose of the investigation is to determine whether or not you have met your residency obligations as a Permanent Resident of Canada as per section A28 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act. In order to establish that you have complied with the residency requirements, you will be required to satisfy the Department that you have been physically present in Canada for at least 730 days in the past 5 years, or that your circumstances are otherwise allowed for by the Act.

A permanent resident complies with the residency obligation provisions if, for at least 730 days with respect to every five year period, the permanent resident is physically present in Canada, or:

 Is accompanying abroad a spouse or common-law partner or in the case of a child, their parent who is a Canadian citizen

 Being employed abroad, on a full-time basis, by a prescribed "Canadian business" or in the public service of Canada or of a province

 Is accompanying abroad a Canadian permanent resident spouse or common-law partner, who is also outside of Canada and who is employed, on a full-time basis, by a prescribed "Canadian business" or in the public service of Canada or of a province.

 Humanitarian and compassionate considerations, taking into account the best interests of a child directly affected by the determination, justifying the retention of the permanent resident status

"Determination of Permanent Resident Status" questionnaire together with photocopies of any supporting documentation and, if applicable, any humanitarian and compassionate considerations relating to the determination of your permanent resident status within thirty (30) days of the date of this letter. This form must be completed in full. Answer every question and do not leave any of the questions blank. If the question is not applicable to you please put a line through the question.

You must provide: Photocopies of <u>all pages of all passports</u> that have been valid during the past 5-years (currently valid or expired). Passport stamps, visas and any

other documents that are not in English or French <u>must</u> be accompanied by a <u>certified</u> translation done in Canada in one of those official languages.

Also, you are requested to complete and submit the attached "Absence History Form" as well as the following documentation that supports your declaration of physical presence in Canada on your application:

Examples of information permanent resident may provide include:

- Social Insurance Number, Driver's Licence and Health Card
- If you are married, your marriage certificate. If your spouse is a Canadian citizen, proof of his/her citizenship.
- If you have children, their birth certificates and school records or proof of employment. Note that if your children are of school age it is necessary to provide proof of school registration during the previous five years.
- Proof of income for last 5 years (Notice of Assessment from the Canada Revenue Agency or copies of you pay-cheque stubs)
- Current letter from your employer.
- Letter from the provincial health insurance authority with your personal claim history for the past five years.
- Letter from your family doctor or dentist stating when you first became his/her patient and listing the dates of all appointments.
- Letter from HRSDC showing contributions to the Canada Pension Plan for the last 5 years
- Patient Medical Expenses list/record from your pharmacy showing name, address and telephone number of the pharmacy and listing dates of service.
- Bankbook(s) or bank statement(s) from financial institution(s) in Canada indicating account activity for the last 5 years. These should show the financial operations of your household.
- Master Card, Visa and/or other credit card statements for the last 5 years.
- Deeds, mortgage papers or leases/rental agreements for the last 5 years.
- Utility bills (e.g. hydro, gas, telephone, cable TV, etc.) for last 5 years.
- Please provide an explanation and court documents relating to convictions or outstanding criminal charges against you.
- If the date of an entry to Canada is not documented by an entry stamp in your passport, alternative proof of entry such as an airline ticket or boarding pass will be required.

If you are employed, work for a Canadian business outside Canada, or are selfemployed, the following documents applicable to your situation will be required:

- Letter of employment signed by your company official indicating the nature of the business and the number of employees in Canada
- copy of your position profile in the company
- your company's accounting records to establish travel expenses
- A copy of corporate Notices of Assessment, specifically "T2 Corporate", for the past 5 years.
- Receipts and Invoices concerning commercial premises (leases, monthly rental invoices/receipts with cancelled cheques, operating permits/licences, strata

authorization, utility bills, insurance premiums and proof of payments for equipment, improvements, vehicles, inventory, etc.)

Receipts for all Revenue Canada remittances

> List the contracts you have obtained through your business activities listing the clients and company representatives you have dealt with personally. Reference letters must include the name, address and telephone numbers of the business owners and/or representatives.

Documents related to your business operations, such as trade/industry licences and or permits, taxation documents (GST/HST/PST remittances, tax returns), photographs of the business, advertisements, invoices, bills of lading, contracts, annual reports, balance sheets and statements of income and expenses.

> Your T4/T4A Summary and Statement of Remunerations, cancelled pay cheques, the payroll registry, CRA source deduction receipts, TD1's, Records of

Employment, proof of WSIB remittances.

Documents concerning financial activities: complete financial statements, tax reports with notices of assessment, business bank statements with cancelled cheques, signing authorities, ledgers, loans and other credit agreements.

Management: signed business contracts, agreements, correspondence, cheques and directives to staff, purchase orders, receipts and invoices in your name for office equipment, furniture, machinery, etc.

Important note on humanitarian and compassionate considerations

If you have acquired less than 730 days physical presence in Canada in the last five years or if you record less than 730 days in Questions 15, 16, 17 and 18 of the Residency questionnaire, please indicate if there are any humanitarian and compassionate considerations that would justify the retention of your permanent residence status and overcome the breach of your residence obligation.

Please note that the responsibility rests with the permanent resident to provide sufficient information and evidence to satisfy an immigration officer that the residency obligation has been/will be met.

If you need more than 30 days to provide the information/documents requested, please write to this office and explain why and how much more time you require. In addition, if you require clarification or more information, please contact the CIC Call Centre at 1-888-242-2100.

Please confirm whether you are presently in Canada. If you are presently outside Canada and do not possess a valid Permanent Resident Card you must contact the nearest Canadian Visa Office to apply for a travel document should you wish to return to Canada.

Note: As per sections 126, 127 and 128 of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, it is an offence under the law to directly or indirectly misrepresent or withhold material facts relating to your application.

Should you fail to comply with this request within the thirty (30) day period, a decision may be made on your case, based on the information currently on file.

If there is insufficient information on file to render a decision and you failed to provide it when requested, or to appear for a personal interview, your case will be abandoned. Abandonment will occur 180 days from the date of initial request.


